And now we gather at this table in response to his commandment, to share the bread and cup of Christ's undying love, and to proclaim our faith.

Celebrant: Breathe your Holy Spirit, the wisdom of the universe, upon

these gifts that we bring to you: this bread, this cup,

ourselves, our souls and bodies, that we may be signs of your love for all the world and ministers of your transforming

purpose.

Through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory is yours, Creator of all, and we bless your holy name for ever.

All: Amen

Celebrant: And now, as our Saviour Christ has taught us, we are bold to

say,

All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy

kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in

heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
